From I-83:

Travel North on I-83 to Exit 50. At Exit 50, take the ramp for US22 toward Colonial Rd. At the light at US22, go straight onto Colonial Rd. Follow Colonial Rd North for 2.7 miles. Turn right onto PA 39 (Linglestown Rd) for ½ mile. St. Andrew's in the Valley is on the left.

From I-76 (PA Turnpike):

Travel on the PA Turnpike to Exit 247. Take the ramp for I-283 toward Harrisburg/Hershey for 2.9 miles. At exit 3B-C, take the right ramp to follow signs for US 322/I-83 North. Travel North on I-83 to Exit 50. At Exit 50, take the ramp for US22 toward Colonial Rd. At the light at US22, go straight onto Colonial Rd. Follow Colonial Rd North for 2.7 miles. Turn right onto PA 39 (Linglestown Rd) for ½ mile. St. Andrew's in the Valley is on the left.

From I-81 North/I-78:

Travel South on I-81 to Exit 77. Turn right onto PA 39 for about 5 miles going around 2 traffic circles. St. Andrew's in the Valley is about 1 mile on the right after the second traffic circle.

From I-81 South:

Travel North on I-81 crossing the Susquehanna River to the exit for US 22/322 West. Follow US 22/322 West toward Lewistown/State College for 1.9 miles. Take the exit onto PA 39 and turn right onto PA 39 (Linglestown Rd) for 4.0 miles. St. Andrew's in the Valley is on the left.

From US 22/322 (State College):

Travel East on US 22/322 around the town of Dauphin. Take the ramp on the right for PA 39 and head toward Linglestown (0.2 miles). Stay straight to the intersection of PA 39 (Linglestown Rd) and turn left at the light. Travel about 4 miles. St. Andrew's in the Valley is on the left.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club, have an AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or are approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds which are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Chapter 2 Section 3. Describes the physical condition of the dog. It does not describe aggressive dogs, or females in heat, which is discussed later in the premium.

Condition of the Dog. Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, they display no signs of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind are able to participate so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can complete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

Chapter 5 Section 34. Warm-Up Area.

One labelled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. Clubs may also place blank containers in the warm-up area if they choose.

Chapter 3 Section 15.

"It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date.

No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$30.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

Harrisburg Kennel Club is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of **20 entries per trial** will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary on or before **Feb 20, 2025**.

Checks for entry fees will not be deposited until the closing date. Checks for entries that are not accepted in the trials will be shredded.

No crating in the building.

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). The staging area will include a waiting area, as well as the secretary's table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

Warm-up area- There will be a warm-up area outside with birch and anise and clove in a scent box.

There will be a briefing in the staging area and handlers will then be able to view the search areas without their dogs.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class.
Search Area Conditions. Searches may be indoors, on matted, carpeted, or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces.
Search Area Sizes will be as defined in the AKC Scent Work regulations.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments, and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5, Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state, "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area."

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged. Handlers may watch the element after their runs.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available and marked.

RIBBONS, AWARDS AND PRIZES

Placement ribbons will be awarded in each class as follows:

A **New Title rosette** will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.

HIGH IN TRIAL- No High in Trial will be offered.

All exhibitors should obtain a copy of the Regulations for Scent Work Trials by downloading them from the American Kennel Club website.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

The **judging Program** will be sent to exhibitors after the trials close via e-mail.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Harrisburg Kennel Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Harrisburg Kennel Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Harrisburg Kennel Club or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be always on leash, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund unless their spot can be filled by an entry on the wait list.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing (including a veterinarian's certificate) must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

ADVISORY

Due to State legislation (Act 181 of 1986) the Harrisburg Kennel Club, Inc. advises exhibitors to have in their possession a current rabies vaccination certificate for each dog over three months of age in their care. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system, or stewards or runners, for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN: Once the time and location for check-in is determined, all exhibitors will be notified by email.

Exhibitors MUST check in for EACH trial in which they are entered.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER’S BRIEFING, AND WARM -UP INFORMATION

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). The staging area will include crating, warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

The **Handler’s Briefing** will take place in the staging area, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler’s Briefing the judge will explain if there’s an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler’s Briefing.

A **warm-up area** the club shall designate a warm-up area. One labelled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. Clubs may also place blank containers.

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From the Regulations:

CHAPTER 2 Section 2. Class Eligibility.

- Novice A Classes are open to dogs who have not completed any title for that particular element, who have not completed a comparable title with another organization, and whose handlers are neither Scent Work judges, nor have ever worked as professional detection dog handlers.

- Novice B Classes are open to all dogs.
- Advanced Classes are open to dogs who have achieved the Novice title for that particular element.
- Excellent classes are open to dogs who have achieved the Advanced title.

CHAPTER 2 - Section 10. Handling More Than One Dog. Handlers may not handle more than one dog in each class. Multiple dogs from the same owner may be entered in the same class, provided they are run by different handlers.

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You must submit ***BOTH PAGES* of the entry form.** It might be easier to use the “stand alone” entry form (printed landscape).
